

LOCAL NEWS NOTES

James Paine was arrested yesterday for stealing three hams from the front of a Market-street butcher's store.

The Market Inspectors visited most of the markets yesterday, with the result that nearly five tons of putrid fish were confiscated.

John F. Harlock was arrested yesterday on the charge of stealing a coat from Thomas Johnson, an East-street restaurant keeper.

The number of commitments to the Industrial School during July was thirty-six, of which number fourteen were girls under 17 years of age.

The State Board of Trade received a shipment of Bartlett pears, Alexander peaches and several varieties of plums from Stanislaus county yesterday. There was also received from J. O. Lovejoy of Tulare a box of peaches, some of which were eleven inches in circumference.

Consul Bee circulated a story yesterday that five Chinese had arrived here en route to China from El Paso a few days ago with their hands and feet manacled, and in the charge of five stalwart customs deputies. Collector Phelps stated that the Chinese were not as badly treated as represented.

John Campbell, a carpenter living at 615 Pine street, had a narrow escape from death yesterday while working on the building in the course of construction at Seventh and Market streets.
