A jury was impaneled in the Police Court yesterday to try Henry Corbett on a charge of misdemeanor. He failed to answer when thrice called, and his bonds of \$300 were declared forfeited, and a bench warrant issued for his re-arrest. He was subsequently arrested and his bail set at \$1000.

The Chinese Consulate.
