ARREST FOR MURDER.

A Man Charged With Killing a Chinese Apprehended.

Nearly two years since the CHRONICLE gave the details of the unprovoked murder of a Chinaman near Colma, in San Mateo county, and the escape of the murderer. Three Chinamen were traveling towards this city. In passing a field where two or three men were digging potatoes, one of them named Burke came out to the road and deliberately struck one of the Chinese with a shovel on the head, completely splitting his skull open, from the effects of which he died in a few hours.
