THE CHINESE MINISTER.

He Will Leave for Washington To-day With His Party.

During the greater part of the time yesterday Tsui Kwo Yin, the new Chinese Minister, and party remained secluded in search of much-needed rest after their long ocean voyage. In the afternoon the entire party took a drive under the guidance of Consul Bee to view some of the notable sights of interest about the city, and in the evening they occupied the time by calling upon a few of the more prominent Chinese residents. The entire party will leave for Washington this morning by special train.

Charged With Grand Larceny.

Antonio Galan was arrested yesterday on a charge of grand larceny. An old gentleman from the country by the name of Southrin, who is in the city for his health, was approached, so he says, by Galan, Wednesday afternoon, who attempted to sell some cigars which he claimed to be of superior quality, at a reduced rate. Southrin claims that during the conversation Galan stood behind him and reached over his shoulder to show him the goods. Some time after the two parted Southrin states he was minus a watch and a pocketbook containing \$55.
